

Director's Note

For our concert performance of *Baby*, we are respectfully using abridged portions of Sybille Pearson's wonderful book in order to give contexts for the songs and preserve the beautifully human intentions of the authors.

Production Biographies

John Housley Housley (Director) directed *Songs for a New World* and *Company* at MSU. A graduate of New York University's Tisch School of the Arts, he has been the acting teacher at Paper Mill Playhouse's Musical Theater Conservatory since 2001, where he has written and directed their New Voices concerts. He is the writer of the acclaimed comedy *Dadetown*, and his film *Jack 1/24/71* was a finalist at the Sundance Institute.

F. Wade Russo (Music Director) is based in Boston and most recently conducted *Oliver* at the Goodspeed Opera House. Other credits include Broadway: associate conductor *By Jeeves;* National Tour: *The Boy Friend,* directed by Julie Andrews; Regional Theater: Huntington Theatre, Pittsburgh Public Theater, Asolo Repertory Theatre, Repertory Theatre of St. Louis, Barrington Stage, Lyric Stage Company and New Repertory Theatre of Boston, Williamstown Theatre Festival, Gateway Playhouse, and Weston Playhouse. He received the St. Louis Critics Award as Outstanding Musical Director/Conductor for *Sunday in the Park with George* in 2013. Russo has taught at Circle in the Square Theatre School, the Juilliard School, Point Park University, and the Boston Conservatory.

Gregory J. Dlugos (Music Supervisor) is currently music supervisor of the Musical Theatre program at MSU. Most recent credits include *A White House Cantata*, *Anything Goes*, and *The Mystery of Edwin Drood*. Last summer he participated in the world premiere of John Luther Adams's *In the Name of the Earth* at Lincoln Center's Mostly Mozart Festival. He was music director and conductor for the world premiere of *Pamela's First Musical* by Cy Coleman and Wendy Wasserstein, also last summer, at the Two River Theater in Red Bank, NJ. At MSU, in addition to supervisory duties, Dlugos conducts MSU Encore for the Musical Theatre program in the Department of Theatre and Dance and also teaches in the John J. Cali School of Music.

Lauren Winston (Production Stage Manager) is a junior BFA Theatre Production/ Design student concentrating in stage management. This is her first show as a production stage manager. Winston has worked as an assistant stage manager at MSU on *Company, Civics and Humanities for Non-Majors,* and *Wedding Band.* She has also been a wardrobe head for *Anything Goes* and *The Mystery of Edwin Drood.*

Cast Biographies

Kristen Brock (Ensemble/Swing) is a current freshman, majoring in the BFA Musical Theatre program. She is originally from Orlando, FL, where she has worked at many professional and regional theater companies. Some of her favorite roles include Reno Sweeney (*Anything Goes*), Millie (*Thoroughly Modern Millie*), Jovie (*Elf*), and Witch (*Into the Woods*), for which she was a nominee at the Jimmy Awards.

Ben Daniel (Ensemble/Nick Understudy) is a sophomore Musical Theatre major at MSU appearing in his third MSU production. Daniel has been doing shows since the age of 12. He won the National Youth Art award for playing Carl Hanratty (Catch Me if You Can).

Ethan Lynch (Doctor/Professor/Ensemble/Alan Understudy) is a senior BFA Musical Theatre major. Favorite MSU roles include Lord Evelyn Oakleigh in *Anything Goes* and Lord Caversham in *An Ideal Husband.* He plays a lot of English lords.
